

A PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLACERVILLE DECLARING SEPTEMBER 11TH: PATRIOT DAY

WHEREAS: The City of Placerville will always remember and honor the nearly three

thousand innocent lives lost on September 11, 2001; as our Great Nation experienced the worst terrorist attack in the history of the United States; and

WHEREAS: September 11th will forever serve as a reminder of the United States of

America's tremendous strength and resilience in the face of devastating loss;

and

WHEREAS: we owe a debt of gratitude to our military, law enforcement, firefighters, first

responders, volunteers and emergency services for the selfless courage they demonstrated in the face of terror while defending our great freedoms; and

WHEREAS: as Americans, we all must come together, and work to unify our community

in order to defend our great freedoms, ensuring that such horrific acts are never again repeated and that our Nation remains the land of the free; and

WHEREAS: as Americans, it is our duty to pay tribute to the victims, families and heroes

of the September 11th, attacks, ensuring their memory lives on; and

WHEREAS: by joint resolution, Public Law 107-89, approved December 18, 2001, the

Congress of the United States of American designated September 11th of each year as Patriot Day, and by Public Law 111-13, approved April 21, 2009, the Congress of the United States of America has requested the observance of September 11th as an annually recognized National Day of Service and
